GOD'S COMMITTMENT

While my family still holds onto a bunch of stuff that isn't useful for our daily life, I am proud of one thing in our household: our garage contains two cars. When we've had them in the past, the same has been true. I don't ever want to have so much that I fill up that space. When my neighbors have to scrape ice and snow off their cars to get going, I have a clean, reasonably warm vehicle to get to work or the store. Possessions should not possess us; they cannot make us any happier than the next guy whom I suspect does better than I do at obtaining them. Much of what I have in my storage space has personal value, with memories or uses throughout the year: Christmas décor, outdoor equipment, old papers, magazines, and books (yes, comics too) from my past. A flood or fire would bring me a great sense of loss, but it is still stuff, and not the people who make all the difference in one's life.

There's a large arc of a story that we're telling this Lenten season about how God has made us his possession. The watchword is covenant, a term we seldom use in our daily life, but perhaps one of the most important for our life under God. As opposed to a contract, believers define the covenant as an agreement where God secures the whole thing. We have our part, but whether we fulfill or fail in our responsibility, God will not go back on what he has promised. What are those guarantees? Oh, you have to come to worship to find that out, but you can guess that it has everything to do with the new, different life that God gives us. It is different because it is so far from how the world measures success.

Let me back that up with scripture. From Deuteronomy 7:

For you are a people holy to the LORD your God; the LORD your God has chosen you out of all the peoples on earth to be his people, his treasured possession. It was not because you were more numerous than any other people that the LORD set

his heart on you and chose you—for you were the fewest of all peoples. It was because the LORD loved you and kept the oath that he swore to your ancestors, that the LORD has brought you out with a mighty hand, and redeemed you from the house of slavery, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt. Know therefore that the LORD your God is God, the faithful God who maintains covenant loyalty with those who love him and keep his commandments.

Then from First Peter 2:

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, *God's own people*, – in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

Peter quotes and refers to the covenant and the prophecy that flowed from it. Where I italicized the passage, the original Greek reads 'a people of his possession.' It is the best thing to know, no matter if times are good or bad, that God holds us close and will never let go or turn his back on us. And to know Christ is all we need, as Paul writes in Philippians 3:

Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, – the righteousness from God based on faith.

With God committing so much to us, we have freedom to give our witness and our offering in confidence that God will bless it to the purpose of Christ Jesus and his Church. Lent calls us to a commitment to honor God in how we give, what we say, and how we respond to the hurts of the world around us.

Again from 1 Peter 2: Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

A NOTE from YOUR CHOIR DIRECTOR

On a cold winter's night, I am still looking at the Moravian star glowing in the dark on our porch. While we are still in the time of Epiphany, I can feel Lent approaching reading the text of a song that a friend of mine sent me. The title of the song reads: God Weeps.

God weeps at love withheld, at strength misused, at children's innocence abused, and till we change the way we love, God weeps.

God bleeds at anger's fist, at trust betrayed, at women battered and afraid, and till we change the way we win, God bleeds.

God cries at hungry mouths, at running sores, at creatures dying without cause, and till we change the way we care, God cries.

God waits for stones to melt, for peace to seed, for hearts to hold each other's need, and till we understand the Christ, God waits.

Another song that I came across today was written by Dietrich Bonhoeffer for New Years Day of the year he was to die. We find it in our hymnal. I want to share a few verses – they remind me of what Pastor writes in his article about God who is the one who never abandons the covenant he has with us no matter how often we break it:

By gracious powers so wonderfully sheltered, and confidently waiting come what may, we know that God is with us night and morning, and never fails to greet us each new day.

And when this cup you give is filled to brimming with bitter suffring, hard to understand, we take it thankfully and without trembling out of so good and so beloved a hand.

By gracious powers so faithfully protected, so quietly, so wonderfully near, we live each day in hope, with you beside us, and go with you through every coming year.

(ELW 626)

And contemplating these words I think of another passage, this time in Paul's letter to the Romans. As we sail through all the bad news we are bombarded with:

For I am sure that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

(Romans 8:38-39)


