## SHOWING THE WAY

In the seasons of the Church Year, when the altar colors are green, we know we're going to hear the common, down-to-earth wisdom of what it is to follow Christ. As I read more and more about what will make good and godly things happen for the church, the message I get is: it's all about discipleship. Even when he was arguing with those who didn't appreciate his understanding of the Law, Jesus still taught what it was God wanted people to do. His friends, his followers, didn't always get what was going on when Jesus put his teaching into action. It was when the Teacher, the Holy Spirit, became part of their being and their way of seeing things that his apostles could act as they had seen their Master do. He was still with them in their ministry.

This is a very important task for the Church to continue to do, now and for always. In our scriptures for this time of year, we first hear how Jesus called people to follow him. But it didn't take long for them, once Jesus had risen and ascended to God, to begin to make disciples of their own. They preached, healed, and dealt with those possessed by unclean spirits. Given how much they knew or didn't know yet, could you have been capable of the same? Do you think of yourself as a disciple? How much do we talk during our worship about what God wants us to do, and then, when we try, we get discouraged because the response falls short?

We do at least three things of vital importance on Sundays in worship. 1. We praise God— as simple as that. 2. We are renewed through the forgiveness of our sins and the sharing of the Lord's Supper, which gives us strength for everything else —which is 3. We learn from Spirit and are sent out by that Spirit to do God's work as disciples of Jesus and servants to the world, the whole world! As we faithfully do our discipleship,

we may find that we'll make disciples too. If we can communicate a sense of purpose and commitment to what God is doing in and through us, we will call people who want that for themselves.

A problem today that is so very hard to overcome is that people have learned to consume religion like we buy things and want to be entertained by stuff, because this makes a person happy. Like some people that heard Jesus say, you will be free, we like that part, but not when he tells his followers how they must serve like him. We are happy to take care of ourselves and our own, but Jesus isn't limited to the five feet around me, or the people who are like me, but goes into the whole world to ALL people.

Even so, our church is responsible for our neighborhood, and it's hard even then to see if we make any impact at all. This is why we do our best when we keep it simple: we can't do everything, but St Peter's has taught and fed people for many years. We provide an education in a Christian setting for thousands of children over the years. We have uncovered a need for healing and prayer, and we will always sing and preach and serve. and enjoy each other's fellowship in the Spirit of togetherness that sets Church apart from most everything else in our society. I think George Bailey of "It's a Wonderful Life" helps me out here — in the midst of a bank run he tells his customers: 'Now come on people, we've got to stay together, we've got to keep faith with each other.' Belonging to each other and to God is the only way I know to make sense out of this life. Tell your friends and neighbors to join us this new year as we who are disciples of Jesus aim to show the way of God to all whom we meet.

# A NOTE from YOUR CHOIR DIRECTOR

For some of us, this time of anticipation for a merry Christmas may be a more difficult one. I just got off the phone with one of my childhood friends who is in the hospital awaiting test results from a biopsy. She also told me that she heard that another family member fell down the stairs while rushing to her ill husband who was needing her attention. It makes me think of the people in our congregation and among our friends who are suffering from illness and are longing for healing.

"Stir up your power," our choir sang last Sunday, "O Lord, and come. Is heaven's moment far or near, and when will Jesus reappear? The coming dawn is our delight in this the darkest hour of night".

The coming dawn can mean healing of our ills, and while it refers to Jesus' return, it can also remind us that the one who is coming has already come. And the circumstances of his birth and the stress of his parents can be compared with what many people are going through here and abroad.

My friend told me she was calmed by the words and music of Psalm 71:1-3: "In you, O

Lord, have I taken refuge; let me never be put to shame. In your righteousness, deliver me and set me free; incline your ear to me and save me. Be my strong rock, a castle to keep me safe; you are my crag and my stronghold."

And because we believe that God has entered our human existence in the person of Jesus Christ, we can still sing – even when our circumstances are difficult:

Love has come, a light in the darkness! Love shines forth in the Bethlehem skies. See, all heaven has come to proclaim it; hear how their song of joy arises: Love! Love! Born unto you a Savior! Love, Love! Glory to God on high.

Love has come and never will leave us!
Love is life everlasting and free.
Love is Jesus within and among us.
Love is the peace our hearts are seeking.
Love! Love! Love is the gift of Christmas.
Love! Love! Praise to you, God on high!
