Last Saturday, driving to church to practice, I listened to the live broadcast of the opera "The Magic Flute" by Mozart. I am fairly familiar with this opera, having listened to it and its many excerpts often. However, I experienced a live performance only once, still a student, when our graduating class visited Salzburg in Austria. We visited their "Marionetten Theater" where the opera was presented with puppets. Fast forward to my broadcast: at one point, close to the end, three boys are singing, heralding the morning and its rising sun which conquers the night of tribulations and temptations and inviting calm and joy into the hearts of men. When I

heard this song, which is not usually played as a separate piece, I suddenly was transported back to my high school days when our music teacher taught this trio, which we sang often with other gems of the classical repertoire. I felt my tears coming up as those days of my childhood became very vivid in my memory.

Playing through the service music for Sunday that afternoon there was a hymn – not in our hymnal but very familiar to most of our worshippers: "The Old Rugged Cross". The words were printed in the bulletin, but people did not need the music for that one, it flowed out of the heart of those gathered, as

one lady let me know after the service. Was that a similar experience for our congregants?

Reflecting on those instances it taught me that music not only calms or excites in general, but that there are pieces that touch our hearts at times which are special because they accompanied us growing up, because they give us comfort and consolation as we go on, and their sound,

COUNCIL SUGGESTIONS AS OF APRIL 6, 2025

- A. My suggestion for church growth is to expand our day school, have a close relationship with them and encourage parents to become part of our church. In the past, we have consistently gained members this way, some of whom are still with us. We have attempted to reach out to the community many times to gain new members but with limited results.
- B. I wonder if it would be possible to reopen the food pantry. I know we closed it a while back but I think it would give us some public notice while staying true to our Christian mission.
- C. Well, the only suggestion I have would be to have 1 service on Sundays, especially during the summer. I realize that it's a "hard sell," but I'm throwing it our there anyway.
- D. My thoughts for growing/saving our church:
 - 1. Start an all volunteer group of any member who could hold a paint brush or pull a weed to start an outside beautification of church.
 - 2. Start increasing our school grade level to eighth grade (reason many parents choose other schools to send their children).
 - 3. Add Pre3 to our current Pre4 and offer a summer school for Pre3-K by our daycare staff.
 - 4. Upgrade classroom technology.
- E. My boss up here in Harford County goes to a small church, and like us, has lost the younger generation. One thing she said has been successful is rotating pastors in the area. Some of the churches in her area have coordinated and put together a schedule where the pastors take turns preaching at each others' church. Or occasionally, bring in a guest speaker for the sermon—could be seminarians, Bishop Gohl, etc.
- F. Restart school club "Wacky Wednesday." Start a Friday night a month activity (movie, games, etc.).
- G. Upper grades to meet at Mar-Lu-Ridge.
- H. Restart shepherding relationships pair a member with school parent attending church services and encourage members to attend school/PACE functions.
