

LISTENING TO JESUS

We feel a lot like Martha when her sister Mary defies convention and actually sits in the company of Jesus as he teaches in their home. She would rather be a student than a host. We know that we need to pay attention to the needs and comforts of family and visitors to our homes, but being a good host also means being present to your friend. Inside our family, we're even worse about accounting who is doing the work, and who is lazing on the couch. (Did I just look at myself in the mirror?) The work of a Christian is never done, but it isn't done alone. When we help each other, that gives us the time to stop and listen, share, and learn from each other.

What do you really hope to hear when you listen to Jesus? It's almost always true that we'd want to know that things will be different. We sometimes say: she'll never be satisfied, or, he wants too much. But there is a way that we should not settle for how this world is, because as much as we'd like to believe in progress, we just as often fall away from the good that God wants for us. Our knowledge has led to a great increase in food production, but tyrants and thieves still prevent others from getting food where it is

needed. And maybe we ought to rethink why people should pay so much for healthy food and basic medicine and healthcare. The question of what is fair should always drive us forward.

In the rest of the Pentecost season, we're going to hear Jesus tell stories that turn our way of thinking upside down. A desperate tax collector gains God's favor when the religious leader who does everything right gives thanks for the wrong things. A rich man is sent to torment, while the poor Lazarus sits at Abraham's side. The grateful Samaritan, the repenting Zacchaeus, the widow who defies the judge: changes are coming to how things are done, and we better open our ears and eyes to what is truly important and valuable. What gets your attention? Is it worth your time? Who will you listen to as we decide what is good in life? 'Your heart is where your treasure is'; and God has never let go of you, so... what's the answer? I know you know!

UBI CARITAS DEUS IBI EST

Our worship service yesterday (5/18) was celebrated around the theme of love. "Love one another!" was Pastor's sermon title and the gospel of John reminded us of Jesus' words to his disciples: *I give you a new commandment: Love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another.* (John 13:34) And our choral response echoed the theme by singing that "Where love is, there is God."

This was masterfully reinforced at a concert we attended in the afternoon at the Cathedral of Mary our Queen. The Baltimore Choral Arts Society gave their final concert of the season. The choices of works sung there gave me a way to fortify the message we heard in the morning. I want to share two things about this concert:

After welcoming the audience, the conductor, forever a bridge builder, built the first one between audience and chorus, by teaching the audience a short refrain: WE ARE THE ONES / WE ARE WAITING FOR, which he had us respond to his verses between refrains:

Gather by the fire, gather at the well. Gather near the temple, gather where you dwell. Gather before sunrise, gather at midday. Gather in the twilight, gather where you lay

We are the ones / We are waiting for.

Who will feed the hungry, who will serve the poor? When will we answer the knock on our door? We are hands and feet; we are answered prayer. When the world needs healing, we will all be there.

We are the ones / We are waiting for

That little song connected a large group of people to another – singers and listeners alike were commissioned to acts of love through what was sung and heard with sounds that filled the beautiful space of the cathedral with majesty and power as well as created sublime intimacy of quietness.

One of the *Five Mystical Songs* by Ralph Vaughan Williams expressed beautifully that God himself is the source of love that keeps us going. Here is the text, written by George Herbert, an English medieval priest and musician:

Love bade me welcome, yet my soul drew back, Guilty of dust and sin.
But quick-ey'd love, observing me go slack
From my first entrance in,
Drew nearer to me, sweetly questioning,
If I lack'd anything.

A guest, I answer'd, worthy to be here: Love said, You shall be he. I the unkind, ungrateful? Ah, my dear, I cannot look on thee. Love took my hand, and smiling did reply, Who made the eyes but I?

Truth, Lord, but I have marr'd them: let my shame Go where it does deserve. And know you not, says Love, who bore the blame?

My dear, then I will serve.

You must sit down, says Love, and taste my meat. So I did sit and eat.
