#### A NEW WORLD

"I was never ready for anything like this?" How many of us can say this in whatever situation we find ourselves in? It could be how our society has changed; how technology has made things easier—or harder. How has work changed for you or your children? People need to learn new skills to keep up with what is expected of us. I didn't imagine having to prepare audio visual programs for worship services, but I am grateful for study materials that come to me with the push of a computer key. Is it good or bad that we are constantly in touch through our cell phones?

We don't miss a lot of the old ways of doing things, but what we've forgotten, or thought we could set aside, has been a great loss. Are there certain books we all should be reading? Are the plays of Shakespeare still worth the time and effort? Believers lament that people don't know Scriptures, and we confess we ought to be better at cracking that Good Book. Alongside knowledge and wisdom, we've moved away from matters of civility and respect. Some blame political correctness and those who push back with 'the hard truth.' Perhaps it's a matter of having good manners and respecting that we have differing opinions.

What this appears to mean for the Church is that our audience is much like the early days of the mission of the apostles. The

culture of our society is more diverse, which is not necessarily a bad thing. People generally seem to be happy finding whatever works for them in terms of a philosophy that is helpful and committed to others. At times we Christians can say about that: 'live and let live,' but then we also have a responsibility to share God's way with those whom God is calling away from ways that lead to death. We believe that God calls us to saves lives.

If our work seems harder because of the variety of opinions and information that swirls around us, then we make it simple. It may be hard to sway those who are satisfied with their lives as they are, and some who have been hurt by how religion, along with other institutions, has hurt their lives. But most people want to know that they are loved and cared for, that we deserve positive regard and meaningful relationships. Those who are hurting need help, and we trust that God's love can save lives through us. Our council has been working toward some renewed outreach for those in need. We've heard time and again, love your neighbor. It's what we're all about, since God has loved us with all the care and help that we've ever needed. Like we all learned in kindergarten, it's a good thing to share!




