#### WORSHIP WARS

Years ago, congregations were struggling with how to welcome new believers and those who fell away from active attendance at church. One answer was to modernize worship, to make it contemporary, the name we've given our second service. St Peter's has done this, with fits and starts, with some success and some setbacks. Contemporary worship is a settled matter these days, and it is helpful in appealing to the school families who have accepted our invitation to attend on a Sunday. It's actually a big ask even when we offer an incentive of discount on next vear's tuition. When someone is already bringing their children to school 5 days a week, coming back on Sunday can be a lot.

I feel blessed, and also really enjoy, working with Richard Stone, Karen Yelovich, and John Lauer as our little, powerful band! We use a variety of resources, and not everyone knows our songs since they might be new to this style. What I believe about how we worship is that whether it's tradition or 'modern', what we want to have is quality—and all our musicians, the band, our organist Bärbel, and the choir members, all provide it. We're doing this for the glory of God before we should ever question if it works for people. Bishop Bill often says to those who say they didn't like a certain hymn, 'we're singing it to God, not for anyone here!'

So if the worship wars can be thought to be over, it's perhaps because we've also expanded the variety of 'traditional' worship. As you who are faithful in attendance know, I have brought many choices to our worship life, since the new hymnals and our online resources mean that 'everything under heaven' is possible! This fall I'm bringing back the hymn of the month, but because I love slogans, I've renamed it Sing a New Song. We'll rehearse 4 new hymns from All Creation Sings that I encountered at our Church-wide Assembly this month. [It's great to get to other worshipping communities when I can find music that may appeal to either of our services—so the band needs to be ready as well!]

Worship at both services follow a simple pattern: the Church's Gathering helps us prepare for worship, we hear the Word of God, we share Jesus' Supper, and Spirit's Sending dismisses us to do God's mission of love and service to our neighbors. This can be as involved or as simple as is required to carry forward the theme of any given Sunday or the Festival and Ordinary seasons of the Church Year. If something isn't necessarily appealing to us at any given time, remember that it's just like our weather – wait a little and it will change! When we worship with our attention on the praise of our savior Jesus and on our gratitude for God's grace, we'll find that we can offer our best, as God did so for us in Jesus' death and resurrection that calls us to the hour of worship!

This week, during the last time of summer holidays, we are enjoying the visit of two of our grandchildren who live in Europe. It is a special treat since the geographical distance does not allow for frequent visits of this nature. #### The Beginnings of Sunday School

Englishman Robert Raikes, born in 1735, was a Christian layman who was pained to see unschooled children working six days a week in factories or mines. On Sundays, children roamed the streets, often getting into trouble. Most didn't know how to read or write and knew nothing about Christ or the church.

As Raikes labored to reform England's prison system, he noticed that many children were imprisoned, stirring him to action on their behalf. He arranged for halls and home to be used for educational purposes on Sundays, the one day children didn't have to work. He found volunteers to teach reading, writing and math, as well as the Bible and Christian beliefs.

The first Sunday school class was held in July 1780. Amazingly, by 1788 some 250,000 children were attending such schools. This occurred despite some people's opposition to the education of lower –class children.

Countless boys and girls have attended Sunday school classes since then, thanks to Raikes, who brought Christ's light and power and love to children around the world.


