

Christmas Good News

It's early November, but one song title is proving to be true: "It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas." Some of us are excited about it. As a cranky old pastor, I say, 'Way too soon!' Not that doing some of your shopping isn't bad, because I also like to get ahead of the big stuff of life, and Christmas is that! So my family just found the best gift for us, which says what I think is so important for our life of faith. It's one of those animated figures that moves a little as the character speaks; it's Linus sharing the Nativity story as he told it in the classic, "A Charlie Brown Christmas." Since I am a professional religious leader, I'm amazed that broadcast TV would simply share the gospel story—I'm

also grateful. I also know that there are plenty of places where we can hear the Good News. If you want to hear it, you can find it.

In one short month, our school's students, young and old, will tell the Christmas Story. It is a straightforward presentation for a simple story. After 2000 years, we're not coming up with anything new. But the story we tell in chapel, in class, and in church, can still renew us daily in knowing that we can trust in God's love, strength, and peace, which is ours because the Child of God was born for us.

A NOTE from YOUR CHOIR DIRECTOR

In preparation for this article, I usually look for inspiration either in Pastor's article or from my favorite devotional, the Moravian Daily Texts. Sometimes those two even match or I try to find the bridge between them.

We are at the end of the church year, and we are saying goodbye to many things. My husband greeted me this morning with the fact that our tree in front of our bedroom window only has 8 leaves left on its branches. When I look out the window from my desk, I see our backyard covered with a blanket of dry leaves. And as the days are getting shorter and many things in our lives will come to an end, the children of our school are looking forward to the preparations for Christmas.

In this in-between time, I come upon this word from the Daily Texts: "Help us, O Lord our God, for we rely on you," (2 Chronicles 14:11) and "Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for God who has promised is faithful." (Hebrews 10:23)

HOPE is the word which is central to this passage and hope is what gives us courage to look ahead. In our German version of these texts Dom Helder Camara, a Brazilian bishop, had this to say about hope: "hope that shies away from risk is not hope ... to hope means to believe in the adventure of love, to trust our human neighbor, to dare the jump into the unknown and to entrust ourselves totally to GOD".

We in the church are entering the new church year, the Advent season full of expectation and yes, hope! And while children's eyes are glowing when they look at the Christmas train running in the Kenilworth Mall anticipating Christmas cheer for them to come, we hold fast to the hope that looks forward to the coming of our Redeemer, a vulnerable child himself. This Advent hymn wants to express the hope we cling to:

All earth is hopeful, the Savior comes at last! Furrows lie open for God's creative task: this, the labor of people who struggle to see how God's truth and justice set everybody free.

People of Israel, you heard the prophet tell: "A virgin mother will bear Emmanuel"; she conceived him, "God with us," our brother whose birth

restores hope and courage to children of this earth.

Mountains and valleys will have to be prepared; new highways opened, new protocols declared. Almost here! God is nearing,

in beauty and grace!

All clear the gateway, in haste, come out in haste!


