#### CHRISTMAS IS FOR SINGING

I don't think I'm going out on a limb by stating that the songs, carols, and choral music that we sing at Christmastime are the best and most beloved of all music. We've begun hearing the secular songs of the season throughout the public spaces in our communities. If you have a streaming music service you may already be playing these holiday or winter pieces about love, family, or the beauty of snow draped trees and the roar of a fire on the hearth. Now I have a lower tolerance than my daughters for holiday music, especially when they don't give me a choice in the matter of what station we're listening to. On the other hand, I am glad to take up the choral work that we offer in worship. I was in my element as a tenor in my high school and college choruses, and when a certain book, Carols for Christmas, from the Oxford University Press, was handed out, I know we were in for fun! I've always enjoyed rehearsing more than when it was time to perform. Because then it's over!

The Bible proves all this true in the first two chapters of Luke's gospel. We have an entire 'book' dedicated to the music of praise and prayer in the Psalms. Moses had composed an actual song that was meant to remind the Israelites what God has done for them in freeing them from being enslaved in Egypt; that's in chapter 32 of Deuteronomy. There are so many more examples of poetry throughout the Bible, especially in the mouth of prophets. but not much explicit singing. But one of my seminary professors believed that what we call speaking in tongues, or glossolalia, may well have been people singing in a language that Spirit provided which came out 'naturally' as music. I'd suspect that a lot of prophetic poetry was sung—it makes it easier to remember words when we set them to music.

But back to Luke. There are four visionary words that the Church has turned into liturgical songs. Mary, meeting Elizabeth, responds to her blessing with her witness to God's radical act in sending the Son of God

to be *her* child, Jesus. That is the glorious *Magnificat*. When Zechariah, Elizabeth's husband and a priest of God, is freed to speak once more, he proceeds to bless God and the son that he named John. The Church calls his 'song' the *Benedictus*. The angels share the good news of *Gloria in excelsis* to the shepherds in the fields, announcing the birth of the Messiah. Then Simeon offers his gratitude that the Lord has come to him so that he could die in peace, the *Nunc Dimittis*.

All these poems have found their way into the church's worship. The Benedictus and Magnificat are part of daily worship. Zechariah's vision is offered at Matins, morning prayer, and Mary turns the world upside down with her canticle during Vespers, evening prayer. The Gloria and Nunc dimittis are part of Sunday's classic order of worship, though we don't have to use them all the time, but may do so whenever they speak to the theme of a season, as during Christmas and Epiphany.

Now whenever I catch a small inspiration as I plan worship, I tend to push everything else aside and run with some grand plan. But I don't want to drive our secretary, music directors, and singers to rebellion by making a change at this point in our schedule for the season. So I won't lose what I've found—now I have an idea for next Christmastime! So stay tuned in December of 2026(!) for the music of Christmas... from the saints themselves!

Reading Pastor's musings about singing all the way through scripture and worship I am almost tempted to embrace it as my report as well – but at the time of this writing we are still looking forward to Thanksgiving – for our family a true festival of thanks - as we share this week with our family living in Europe, but coming to visit us, together, as four generations in one rare moment of our lives. Yes, there is a new baby, our great granddaughter whom we are fortunate to see – a little foretaste to the wonder of Christmas we are looking forward to.

So, it is still Advent time, a time of waiting. The nights are still getting darker, and many problems are weighing heavy – but Advent is also full of singing, expressing both the longing for peace and deliverance, the hope of the promised Savior, and the exuberant joy of Mary's song when she, just pregnant, visits her cousin Elizabeth.

When we look at Eleni's little face smiling at us and her little hands discovering how to move the little toys hanging over her little chair, but also knowing how much she depends on her Mommy for nourishment and safety – it is a miracle to believe that it is through such an infant that wholeness and blessing can and will come to us if we let it. God's ways cannot be defined by our human boundaries, as he cannot be boxed into our ways of understanding.

But we can sing, even in our time of waiting and especially then when it is hard. One of the new songs of Advent we are going to be singing in the next few weeks is giving words to the fear and longing surrounding us even in the middle of the pre-Christmas buzz: Come now, O God,
when our love is forsaken.
Come, when our bedrock of faith
has been shaken.
Come, when our deepest hopes
are mistaken.
Come, Emmanuel. Come Emmanuel.

Come, put an end
to our self-serving madness.
Come, while the world
is enshrouded in sadness.
Come, turn our tears
of our mourning to gladness.
Come, Emmanuel.
