GOD'S WORD

Psalm 23

The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not be in want.

The LORD makes me lie down in green pastures and leads me beside still waters.

You restore my soul, O LORD, and guide me along right pathways for your name's sake.

Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death,
I shall fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil, and my cup is running over.

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever.

READING: Revelation 7:9-17 Contemporary English Version Christ is the shepherd who leads his faithful to springs of the water of life. Christ is also the lamb who vanguishes sin and suffering.

This is a responsive reading from the Revelation of Christ, chapter 5. John writes: After this, I saw a large crowd with more people than could be counted. They were from every race, tribe, nation, and language, and they stood before the throne and before the Lamb. They wore white robes and held palm branches in their hands, as they shouted,

"Our God, who sits upon the throne, has the power to save his people, and so does the Lamb."

The angels who stood around the throne knelt in front of it with their faces to the ground. The elders and the four living creatures knelt there with them. Then they all worshiped God and said,

"Amen! Praise, glory, wisdom, thanks, honor, power, and strength belong to our God forever and ever! Amen!"

One of the elders asked me, "Do you know who these people are that are dressed in clean, bright robes? Do you know where they come from?"

"Sir," I answered, "you must know."

Then he told me:

"These are the ones who have gone through the great suffering."

They have washed their robes in the blood of the Lamb and have made them clean.

And so they stand before the throne of God and worship in God's temple day and night.

The one who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them.

They will never hunger or thirst again,

and they won't be troubled by the sun or any scorching heat.

The Lamb in the center of the throne will be their shepherd.

He will lead them to streams of life-giving water, and God will wipe all tears from their eyes."

This is the Word of God, word of life.

HOLY GOSPEL: John 10:22-30

Jesus responds to questions about his identity with the remarkable claim that he and the Father are one. Those who understand this are his sheep; they hear his voice, follow, and will never be snatched from his hand.

This is the Holy Gospel as the Word was given to John, the 10th chapter.

At that time the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. So the Judeans gathered around him and said to him, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly."

Jesus answered, "I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; but you do not believe, because you

do not belong to my sheep. My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand. The Father and I are one."

This is the Good News of Christ's Victory.
