The CHURCH'S GATHERING

WELCOME Theme of the day, Prayer concerns

CONFESSION and FORGIVENESS

We make the sign of the cross, which was marked on us at baptism. We bless the holy Trinity, ⊕ one God, the God of manna, the God of miracles, the God of mercy. **Amen**

CALL to WORSHIP and PRAYER of the DAY

Praise the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ for the spiritual blessings that Christ has brought us from heaven!

The Father treated us with undeserved grace because of the Son God dearly loves,

GOD'S WORD

FIRST READING: Ezekiel 17:22-24

Tree imagery is used in a messianic prophecy to tell how the Lord will choose someone from Judah's royal family (the cedar tree) to reign over all creation. This tree will be planted on Mount Zion, the location of the holy temple.

This is a reading from the prophet Ezekiel, the 17th chapter.
Thus says the Lord God: I myself will take a sprig
from the lofty top of a cedar; I will set it out.

I will break off a tender one
from the topmost of its young twigs;
I myself will plant it on a high and lofty mountain.
On the mountain height of Israel I will plant it,
in order that it may produce boughs and bear fruit,
and become a noble cedar.
Under it every kind of bird will live;
in the shade of its branches will nest
winged creatures of every kind.
All the trees of the field shall know that I am the LORD.
I bring low the high tree, I make high the low tree;

This is the Word of God, word of life.

SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 5:6-10, 14-17

I dry up the green tree and make the dry tree flourish.

I the LORD have spoken; I will accomplish it.

Paul encourages believers to live by faith and not by sight. We do not consider Jesus from a human perspective but through the eyes of faith, believing he died for all and was raised. All who are in Christ are now in God's new creation.

This is a reading from Paul's letter to the believers at Corinth, the 5th chapter.

So we are always confident; even though we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord—for we walk by faith, not by sight. Yes, we do have confidence, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. For all of us must appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil. For the love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore all have died. And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for Christ who died and was raised for them.

From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!

This is the Word of God, word of life.

HOLY GOSPEL: Mark 4:26-34

Jesus frequently uses parables to teach ordinary people as they are able to hear and understand. Images of sowing and growing show the vitality of God's kingdom.

This is the Holy Gospel as the Word was given to Mark, the 4th chapter. Jesus said, "The realm of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how. The earth produces of itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. But when the grain is ripe, at once he goes in with his sickle, because the harvest has come."

He also said, "With what can we compare the realm of God, or what parable will we use for it? It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."

With many such parables Jesus spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it; he did not speak to them except in parables, but Jesus explained everything in private to his disciples.

This is the Good News of Christ's Victory.
