GOD'S WORD

READING: Lamentations 3:22-33 Common English Bible The book of Lamentations is one of our most important sources of information about the fall of Jerusalem to the Babylonians in 587 BCE. Though the people admit that God's judgment was just, today's reading declares a fervent trust that God will not leave them forever.

A: This is a reading from Lamentations, the 3rd chapter.

Certainly the faithful love of the LORD hasn't ended;

certainly God's compassion isn't through!

They are renewed every morning. Great is your faithfulness.

I think: The LORD is my portion! Therefore, I'll wait for him.

The LORD is good to those who hope in him, to the person who seeks him.

It's good to wait in silence for the LORD's deliverance.

It's good for a man to carry a yoke in his youth.

He should sit alone and be silent when God lays it on him.

He should put his mouth in the dirt—perhaps there is hope.

He should offer his cheek for a blow; he should be filled with shame.

My Lord definitely won't reject forever.

Although he has caused grief, God will show compassion in measure with his covenant loyalty.

God definitely doesn't enjoy affliction, making humans suffer.

This is the Word of God, word of life.

We give our thanks to God.

Psalm 30 (read responsively)

I will exalt you, O LORD, because you have lifted me up and have not let my enemies triumph over me.

O LORD my God, I cried out to you, and you restored me to health.

You brought me up, O LORD, from the dead; you restored my life as I was going down to the grave.

Sing praise to the LORD, all you faithful; give thanks in holy remembrance.

God's wrath is short; God's favor lasts a lifetime.

Weeping spends the night, but joy comes in the morning.

While I felt secure, I said,

"I shall never be disturbed.

I pleaded with my Lord, saying,


"What profit is there in my blood, if I go down to the pit? Will the dust praise you or declare your faithfulness?

*WELCOMING the GOSPEL: "Listen, God is Calling"



1 Jesus gave his mandate: share the good news that he came to save us and set us free. *Refrain*

*HOLY GOSPEL: Mark 5:21-43

Jairus, a respected leader, begs Jesus to heal his daughter. A woman with a hemorrhage was considered ritually unclean and treated as an outcast. Both Jairus and the unnamed woman come to Jesus in faith, believing in his power to heal and bring life out of death.

P: This is the Holy Gospel as the Word was given to Mark, the 5th chapter. **We give glory to you, O Lord.**

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered around him; and he was by the sea. Then one of the leaders of the synagogue named Jairus came and, when he saw him, fell at his feet and begged him repeatedly, "My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well, and live." So Jesus went with him.

And a large crowd followed him and pressed in on him. Now there was a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years. She had endured much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had; and she was no better, but rather grew worse. She had heard about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, for she said, "If I but touch his clothes, I will be made well." Immediately her hemorrhage stopped; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. Immediately aware that power had gone forth from him, Jesus turned about in the crowd and said, "Who touched my clothes?" And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing in on you; how can you say, 'Who touched me?" He looked all around to see who had done it. But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling, fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. Jesus said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."

While he was still speaking, some people came from the leader's house to say, "Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the teacher any further?" But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the leader of the synagogue, "Do not fear, only believe." He allowed no one to follow him except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they came to the house of the leader of the synagogue, he saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. When he had entered, he said to them, "Why do you make a commotion and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping." And they laughed at him. Then he put them all outside, and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him, and went in where the child was. Jesus took her by the hand and said to her, "Talitha cum," which means, "Little girl, get up!" And immediately the girl got up and began to walk about (she was twelve years of age). At this they were overcome with amazement. He strictly ordered them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.

This is the Good News of Christ's Victory.


