WELCOME Theme of the day, Prayer concerns, & Praise time:

CONFESSION and FORGIVENESS

We bless the God ⊕ of Incarnation, Advent, and Epiphany: alive in the world, reviving creation, arriving soon. **Amen**

We confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another. Silence is kept for reflection. God of mercy, we confess that we have sinned. We trust earthly powers and human authority alone. We grow fearful. We cling to false comforts.

GOD'S WORD

READING: Isaiah 12:2-6

This is a responsive reading from the prophet Isaiah, the 12th chapter. Surely God is my salvation;

I will trust, and will not be afraid, for the LORD GOD is my strength and my might, and has become my salvation. With joy you will draw water

from the wells of salvation.

And you will say in that day:

Give thanks to the LORD, call on God's name;

make known the deeds of the LORD among the nations;

proclaim that this name is exalted.

Sing praises to the LORD, for he has done gloriously;

let this be known in all the earth.

Shout aloud and sing for joy, O royal Zion,

for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.

This is the Word of God, word of life.

HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 3:7-18

John the Baptist heralds the mighty one who is coming. John teaches that preparation for God's reign is not a matter of identity but of bearing fruits of merciful justice, radical generosity, and vocational integrity.

This is the Holy Gospel as the Word was given to Luke, the 3rd chapter. John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."

And the crowds asked him, "What then should we do?" In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He said to them, "Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what should we do?" He said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages."

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." So, with many other exhortations, John proclaimed the good news to the people.

This is the Good News of Christ's Victory.
